COURSE DESCRIPTION

CENG 1010 / BIEN 2990 / ENEG 2990 is designed to provide new students in the CBE department with an introduction to the department, including faculty, staff, alumni, senior undergraduate students, and postgraduate students. Through experience sharing, it also serves to encourage students to pursue and plan for a more holistic and fulfilling undergraduate experience, one that includes academic achievements as well as co-curricular experiences (e.g., exchange, internship, research, etc.).

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the end of this course, students should be able to:

- Appreciate the versatility and breadth of an engineering education.
- Develop a sense of belonging to the department and the profession of chemical, biological and energy engineering.
- Recognize the need and benefit of out-of-classroom, co-curricular learning experiences.
- Formulate a personalized study plan that includes both academic courses and cocurricular activities

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

IN-CLASS ACTIVITIES

We meet every Friday, 12:00–1:20 pm, in Lecture Theater D OR G010 CYT Bldg, depending on the arrangement of the activities for that week. For specific sessions, the group may be further divided into separate rooms based on your major/interested major. Please keep an eye on the schedule in Canvas and on our announcements.

Learning activities in this course involve active classroom participation on your part. <u>To pass</u> <u>the course, you are required to attend ALL sessions in person on time</u> (we also count late arrival or early departure as absent), unless otherwise stated. Activities will include guest lectures, experience sharing, and workshops.

Excused absence: If you have good justifications for missing a session, please seek approval by emailing the TA (with documented proof) <u>before</u> the session, unless it is an unforeseen emergency, in which case the notification can come after the session.

PREPARING FOR CLASS

For some sessions, you will be given some reading materials or short videos to watch beforehand, with some quick assignments that you need to complete based on those materials. These are all conducted online in Canvas.

DREAM CV AND STUDY PLAN

To pass the course, you will prepare a one-page "dream CV" and a study plan, and submit them in Canvas. The exact details will be announced later.

We will survey your broad academic interests during the course to form mentor groups and assign your academic mentor from the CBE department. This approach aims to help you to connect to your peers with similar interests going forward in your studies.

Senior CBE students will organize fun (and subsidized!) social activities for you to join to get to know your classmates in a relaxed environment. These activities will be organized outside the regular class hours and are optional. You are strongly encouraged to join them to have fun and get to know your classmates better.
